1 – Overall objective	Quality music provision in every class and excellent opportunities for pupils to play a range of musical instruments and perform in and out of school.

3 – Classroom instrumental teaching	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Long-term/mid-term planning is a bespoke plan from the Shropshire Music Service. • Lessons are delivered by class teachers, once every three weeks they are supported by a member of Shropshire Music Service • Continue to upskill staff, especially due to staffing changes.
4 – Implementation of key components	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bespoke long-term and medium-term planning in place. • Assessment in place using the Shropshire Music Service progression mapping. • Currently we have weekly singing assemblies, this is an area for development. • In addition to the whole school Christmas concert 2023-24 we will have the first North Shropshire School's concert in the summer term.
5 – Communication activities	Communicate plans with parents through Microsoft Sway Newsletters, school website, Facebook and Class Dojo.
6 – Evaluation process for the success of the Music Development Plan	Evaluation meeting on a termly basis between Music leader and Music Specialist.

7 – Transition work with local secondary schools	This is an on-going target. Shropshire Music Service are currently communicating with local secondary schools. Shropshire Music Service to liaise with neighbouring music services for some secondaries.
8 – Budget materials and staffing	Budget in place for CPD for 2023-24 to cover a music specialist.
9 – Pupil Premium and SEND provision	Effective use of teaching assistants to support SEND pupils during the delivery of music.
